

## Class 2 Topic Letter Summer Term 2- 2024

English:

In our English lessons this half term we will be focusing on writing persuasive adverts, nonchronological reports and

auto/biographies.

**Reading:** We will have reading time every day, were the children will be able to quiz on their reading book and to read to Mrs Thomsen. We will choose our 'class book' and through reading this, we will maintain our positive attitudes to reading and understanding of what we have read.

**Spelling:** We will continue with our spelling homework each week. While in class we will work on spelling strategies to help us.

Grammar: Year 3: Formation of nouns using a range of prefixes; using the forms 'a' or 'an' according to whether the next word begins with a consonant or a vowel; creating word families based on common words to show how words are related in form and meaning. • Expressing time, place and cause using conjunctions, adverbs or prepositions. • Introduction to paragraphs as a way to group related material; headings and sub-headings to aid presentation; use of the present perfect form of verbs instead of the simple past. Introduction to inverted commas to punctuate direct speech. Year 4: Grammatical difference between plural and possessive '-s'; Standard English forms for verb inflections. • Noun phrases expanded by the addition of modifying adjectives, nouns and preposition phrases; fronted adverbials. • Use of paragraphs to organise ideas around a theme; appropriate choice of pronoun or noun within and across sentences to aid cohesion and avoid repetition. •Use of inverted commas and other punctuation to indicate direct speech; apostrophes to mark plural possession; use of commas after fronted adverbials.

### Maths:

This half term we will be learning about time, shape, position and direction and statistics. **Pupils will be** taught to: Year 3: tell and write the

time from an analogue clock and 12-hour and 24-hour clocks; estimate and read time with increasing accuracy to the nearest minute; record and compare time in terms of seconds, minutes and hours; use vocabulary such as o'clock, am/pm, morning, afternoon, noon and midnight; know the number of seconds in a minute and the number of days in each month, year and leap year; compare durations of events [for example, to calculate the time taken by particular events or tasks), draw 2-D shapes and make 3-D shapes using modelling materials; recognise 3-D shapes in different orientations and describe them, recognise angles as a property of shape or a description of a turn, identify right angles, recognise that 2 right angles make a half-turn, 3 make three-quarters of a turn and 4 a complete turn; identify whether angles are greater than or less than a right angle, identify horizontal and vertical lines and pairs of perpendicular and parallel lines, interpret and present data using bar charts, pictograms and tables, solve one-step and two-step questions [for example 'How many more?' and 'How many fewer?'] using information presented in scaled bar charts and pictograms and tables

**Year 4**: read, write and convert time between analogue and digital 12and 24-hour clocks; solve problems involving converting from hours to minutes, minutes to seconds, years to months, weeks to days, compare and classify geometric shapes, including quadrilaterals and triangles, based on their properties and sizes, identify acute and obtuse angles and compare and order angles up to 2 right angles by size, identify lines of symmetry in 2-D shapes presented in different orientations, complete a simple symmetric figure with respect to a specific line of symmetry, describe positions on a 2-D grid as coordinates in the first quadrant, describe movements between positions as translations of a given unit to the left/right and up/down, plot specified points and draw sides to complete a given polygon

**In Science**, we will continue to look at Electricity. During this unit of work, children will learn to sort common electrical appliances into battery and mains powered. They will construct simple series circuits containing a variety of components and understand the difference between complete and incomplete circuits. They will be able to identify whether or not a bulb will light in a simple series circuit and put forward ideas to fix incomplete circuits. The children will plan and conduct an investigation to discover which materials make good insulators and design, construct and test their own switches.

General scientific vocabulary: Investigate, Measure, Changes, Prove, Observe, Predict, Simple Tests, Identify, Classify, Groups, Gathering/Recording Data, Equipment, Questioning, experiment.

Key Vocabulary: appliance, battery, circuit, components, conductor, current, electrical, insulator, mains power, portable, pylon, switch.

Key Question: What is electricity? Where does electrivity come from?

**In Geography** this half term we will be taking a close look at the world and how it is represented on maps. Children will discover the different countries and capital cities of Europe as well as recapping the countries and cities of the UK. Children will specifically focus on Italy and will learn the key human and physical features of the country before focusing on the region of Campania. Children will then use their knowledge to compare their own region in England with Campania and establish similarities and differences between the two.

In Year 3 and 4 we place great importance on learning x tables so there will be tables set to learn each week and this will be informally tested throughout the week during lessons and during the formal test once a week on a Friday. Logging into TT Rock Stars will also help with times table's knowledge.
