Please note: **ALL** children **MUST** know their times tables up to 12 times 12, and be able to recall quickly. School 360 Times Table Blast and Sumdog plus KS2 SATS Blaster (for Year 6 pupils) are all useful and should be used to develop speed and fluency.

In this half-term, we begin by celebrating the works of the world-renowned and loved Roald Dahl. This will include us using the text of Charlie & The Chocolate Factory to study and then create wonderful and descriptive character descriptions (something done so well by Roald Dahl). As well as using these books

within our English sessions, we will also use them for several guided reading sessions too.

Throughout all units of writing where we study and develop our skill in writing, we will constantly be addressing and strengthening our knowledge and use of SPaG features. Homework will be set to strengthen this further each week during this half-term.

Our first genre of writing that we will study and create will be character descriptions. We will use characters from a range of books, including Goodnight Mister Tom as a basis for this, both to study how a professional author constructs an effective character description as well as analyse the features, such as figurative language, to develop these skills and create our own.

Our next genre of writing will be to study persuasive adverts. This will include looking at adverts for shows (both televised and from the theatre) as well as other modern-day examples, focussing on features, such as emotive language and using a range of punctuation to vary our sentences for effect.

Our final genre of writing for this half-term will be a newspaper article. We will again start by looking at real-life examples and analysing these before practising the identified writing features of a newspaper, such as parenthesis, quotes and being able to write succinctly whilst in formal voice.

We will continue to develop our reading comprehension skills through our guided reading sessions and use of Accelerated Reader, as well as increasing understanding of written grammar through writing analysis.

Please hear your child read daily and write a message/ sign/ initial your child's Reading Record book.

Our unit for this half-term is 'Why Do Christians Believe That Jesus Was The Messiah?' where the children will look at information from several Bible stories in order to establish what is meant by a

'messiah' and how this related to such stories. They also will use this to see what is meant by a leader and apply this in other contexts.



Children will be taking part in daily exercise each morning through our 'daily mile'. Key taught sessions during this half-term will include multiskills where the children will develop a range of sporting skills and fitness aspects.

Key vocabulary:

Stretch, muscles, ligaments, tendons, throwing, catching, core, strength, stamina, endurance, sportsmanship, respect, tenacity, teamwork, communicating, anticipation.

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During this half-term, we will be studying the why mountains are so important. This will include:

- defining what a mountain is,
- how and why they can be formed,
- the effect that mountains have on the

physical environment,

-the effect of mountains on human geography.

Key vocabulary:

The unit that we will be covering in our French lessons is all about going to a café and ordering items. This will be done through reading, writing, listening to and speaking associated French phrases and

sentences. This will also enable the children to build upon




We will be focusing on performance techniques, with a particular view to preparing for both our Christmas productions and our Christmas service. This will include:

In our PSHCE/ RHE work we will be focusing on a unit titled 'Ourselves, growing and changing'. Within this unit, we will study and develop our understanding and application of how we view ourselves and others. This includes reflecting on

our own identity and that of others as well as equality and our rights.

In this unit learners will find out that vector images are made up of shapes. They will learn how to use the different drawing tools and how images are created in layers. They will explore the ways in which images can be

grouped and duplicated to support them in creating more complex pieces of work.



In Science during this half-term, we will be focusing on scientific enquiry. This will see the children consider each of the steps of a true scientific investigation. We will study and develop how to conduct fair and considered investigations and put this into practise with some experiments.

Key vocabulary:

Vector, geometric, overlay, rotation, perspective, logos,

represent, duplicate, copy, enlarging, reduce, positioning.

Our unit for this half-term is titled 'Mechanical System: Gears and Pulleys' where we will be investigating and analysing existing systems before designed and creating our won.

Within this unit, we will:

- -understand how gears and pulleys work,
- -identify where gears and pulleys can be found,
- -evaluate and appraise existing designs,
- -plan our own designs,
- -consider materials, budget, time and functionality when designing a product,
- -assemble a design from the plans made,
- -evaluate and adapt designs based on evidence.

Key vocabulary:

Annotate, axel, force, gear, input machine, mechanism, market research, output, brief, pulley, renewable energy, sustainability, teeth, cog, evaluate, adaptations.
