£16,100 allocated additional spend allocated from PE SDP Budget

£12,010	Totally transform 50 % of the outdoor provision - all weather surfacing plus specialist low level climbing apparatus	The grassed area in the EY outdoor space is unusable for a good proportion of the school year as it becomes very wet and muddy. There has also been a lot of improvements to climbing equipment for KS1 and 2 over the last 5 year plan but not equipment that can be independently accessed by 3-5 year olds therefore spend is needed to be allocated here so that there is 'a sustainable impact for all pupils'. Physical development has been an area identified as needing further development.	Early Years Physical Development Project. The impact of this project is massive. The children have been able to access outdoor physical activity throughout the year. The movable climbing apparatus is age and ability appropriate and has definitely had an impact on standards in physical development. The project was able to be fully funded due to the Primary Sports funding as well as sponsorship and grant applications.
£1500 towards the total staffing cost (£500 of this is Bronze package rugby coaching).	<i>Primary schools are encouraged to use their PE and Sport premium funding in a way that has sustainable impact for all pupils</i>	Contribution towards staffing the afternoons, enabling HLTA to deliver PE across the year in KS1 and UKS2. Newcastle Thunder coach 1 day per week for 8 weeks so that all children can access this provision plus all staff can have CPD as they attend the lessons.	Newcastle Thunder were unable to provide a coach for a second year running so we accessed further training for our HLTA delivering PE through our SSCO for Northumberland School Games. We were also able to extend our festival and competition participation(see budget already allocated on p2) as we used the remaining budget on transport and participation costs which had a positive impact on KS2 pupils in particular.
£500	Maintenance budget for PE equipment renew and refresh.	Equipment continues to be well used and needs to continue to be refreshed and replaced.	Stock re-freshed and updated, SDP PE budget also needed as the costs of equipment has risen.
£1000	New planning and assessment scheme of work for PE (as per Ofsted action point)	New planning and assessment in place. Staff CPD.	We reviewed a number of schemes and as a whole staff team decided on Get Set 4 PE because of the quality of planning and the clear progression and assessment.

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£1000	Markings on EYFS area to encourage active play	A large proportion of the time for physical development in EYFS is in the EYFS outdoor area. Playground markings and traditional games will encourage more active play.	Markings have had a positive impact on the EY outdoor space and active play.
£1000 –	Full subsidy of transport to festivals and sporting competitions.	So that as a rurally isolated school we are not disadvantaged due to our location and can attend sporting events freely without asking families for contributions at this time of particular economic hardship.
